In this presentation, Brandon will discuss policy issues and practical guidance for school boards associated with student discipline matters (including a focus on SB100) and transgender issues. Crisis Management Requires Readiness

Presented by Mark Twomey, Superintendent, Macomb CUSD 185

Mark will share his recommendations on the consortium model of crisis management readiness and the multiple responsibilities leaders of small and rural schools have. As part of the consortium model, the first phase of the United States Rural School Safety Project ensures every district participating has a research-based plan and the ability to implement it. The next phase consists of creating roles and responsibilities for each district within the consortium as well as intense training, and determining how each will respond to a neighboring district's needs during a crisis. By working together, each district becomes "crisis ready" and is able to communicate that readiness to its respective community. Mark is the founder of the Center for Optimal Learning and the creator of the United States Rural School Safety Project. He is an expert in the field of crisis management readiness for rural and small schools in the State of Illinois.
